MSF5 Undertaking #4 2012

Establishment of robust monitoring and evaluation system. Action points:

- Publish the NWI (2003 EFY) data
- Complete the pilot of the WASH M&E-MIS and commence roll-out in 300 woredas
- ...implement a collaborative Sustainability Strategy to ensure the NWI is updated annually and the data is used for planning at all levels...
- Train adequate human power and procure required equipment ... 300 Woredas ...
- Introduce the plan and budget to equip other remaining woredas ...

MSF5 Undertaking #4 2012

- Prepare strategic action plan and monitoring system ... commitments ... High Level meeting in 2012.
- Carry out the Joint Technical Review (JTR) 8 event held six months after the MSF 5
- Produce consolidated Annual WaSH Sector Reports for JTR 9 .. one month before MSF 6 and organize MSF 6.
- Increased involvement of development partners (donors, CSOs and private sector) in the implementation of all action points
